### Lanes 35-36

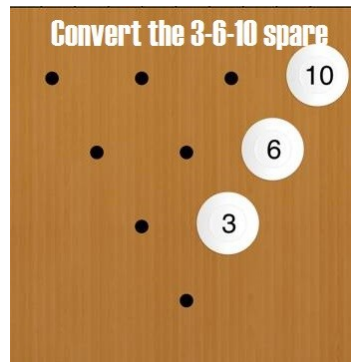
